### Fiction - Portal Tale

Use a range of writing and grammatical tools such as: show don't tell, power of three, alliteration, similes, relative clauses, speech and personification to craft a descriptive story.

Evaluate and edit writing, searching for consistency in spelling and punctuation as well as areas of grammar such as the subjunctive form.

### Non-Fiction - Non Chronological Report

Plan, draft and write a non chronological report considering organisational devices

Ensure there is a consistent and correct use of tense throughout a piece of writing.

Use a range of high level punctuation including semi-colons,

brackets and dashes to indicate parenthesis or mark boundaries.
