YEAR 4 Ancient Greeks Assemble!

Year 4 have been exploring the Ancient world of Greece so far this term and as part of that enjoyed dressing up for a Greek workshop day last week. As part of the exciting session, presented by one of the BBC's Horrible Histories team, the children took part in some amazing activities;

- The children examined artefacts, weapons and equipment used in 2000BCE!
- Then worked collaboratively to complete a scavenger hunt of facts all about the ancient Greeks ranging from the Olympics to democracy.
