

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Did you know:



Research clearly shows how being in school on time, every day, improves life chances and gives children the best possible opportunities to flourish, both academically and socially. Please make every effort to ensure your child is at school on time each day and works towards achieving 100% attendance.

Of course, do not bring your child to school if they are ill, but do consider still getting them into school if all they have is a sniffle or are feeling a bit tired or 'under the weather'!

As a school, we aim to exceed our target of 97% attendance across the school and want to work in partnership with Children and parents to make sure that our attendance is aspirational, along with all aspects of our curriculum.

Being **at school** ensures that children are available to receive and make the very most of educational experiences, in order to best set them up for life as kind and educated citizens. We can only do this with the continuing support of parents, combined with the efforts of the children.

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Please try to make any medical appointments after school or in the school holidays. If it is unavoidable, appointment letter/cards should be provided to school for absence to be authorised. Where urgent appointments are required a stamped and timed card should be requested from the medical receptionist.

LEAVE OF ABSENCES

Leave of Absence forms are available from the school office or can be downloaded from the school website if you would like to request leave during term time. School does not allow holidays in term time.

Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances and gives no entitlement to parents to take their child on holiday during term time. The Headteacher must be satisfied that the circumstances are exceptional and warrant the granting of leave.

Please DO NOT book holidays before speaking with the Attendance Officer.

All Year 2 and Year 6 pupils must attend school during for statutory tests.

PUPIL PREMIUM LETTER

You will have received a letter via Parentmail regarding Pupil Premium and Service Premium. This premium provides schools with extra funding to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils from Reception to year 11. In order to receive this additional funding we are required to provide information to the Department for Education confirming which children meet the government criteria.

If you qualify for the appropriate benefits but have chosen not to apply for free school meals please consider applying. You do not have to take up the free school meal to attract the funding for your child's school. If you have any questions regarding this please contact the school office.

CHRISTMAS POST

The Christmas Post Boxes will be available for use from **Monday 9 December**. Please ensure the envelopes have the name and class of the child they are being sent to clearly written on the front. Year 6 pupils will deliver to classes each day. Class teachers will let the children know where the post boxes will be.

CHRISTMAS LUNCH

The school Christmas lunch will be on **Friday 13 December**. If you have not replied to the form confirming that your child would like a Christmas lunch please ensure that your child has a packed lunch with them on that day. If your child would like to wear a Christmas hat for the lunch please send it into school on **Friday 13 December**.

CHRISTMAS PARTIES

Our school Christmas parties take place in the last week of term. The dates are included in the 'dates for your diary' above. All children can come to school dressed in their party clothes on the day of the party. Please send a donation of £1 into your class teacher towards the party food by **Wednesday 11 December 2019**.

NURSERY

On the last day of term the timings for the nursery sessions have changed to ensure that every child is in nursery for the same length of time. The timings are as follows:

Morning school will be from 8:30am-10:45am

Afternoon School will be from 11:45am-2pm.

Children staying will have lunch as normal at a slightly earlier time of 11am.

KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE

- **STAFF CAR PARK** Please note that when dropping off or collecting from Connect, parents are not allowed to park in the staff car park until after 5pm. Pedestrians should not enter the school grounds via the car park gate as this is the vehicle entrance.
- **END OF DAY** At the end of the school day, if children are not collected they stay with their teacher until 3.20 pm and are then taken to the school office. Whilst we understand that, from time to time parents may be unavoidably delayed, there are an increasing number of children being picked up after 3.20pm from the office. This can be very upsetting for the children and disrupts the work of the office team. Please try to pick your children up on time.
- **WATCHES** Some children are coming to school wearing watches which have recording apps that can be uploaded to mobile phones. These watches are inappropriate and should not be worn to school.

YEAR 4

This week Year 4 went to visit themselves in at the Steve McQueen Year 3 exhibition at the Tate Britain.

Turner Prize-winning artist and Oscar-winning filmmaker Steve McQueen's exhibition involved schools all over London. It involved having a traditional photograph from specially trained photographers. We went to visit our final photographs at the exhibition in central London.

As well as looking at our own published work we also looked at other artists and paintings in the gallery to inspire our still life drawing in school.
