English



Segment sounds in simple words, blend together, and know which letters represent some of them.

Link sounds to letters, naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet.

Begin to read words and simple sentences.

Attempt to write short sentences.

Recognise rhyme in familiar nursery rhymes and enjoy learning the 'rhyme of the week'.


Write letters using the Read Write Inc. handwriting rhymes and record daily in their English book.

Orally recall the main events from a story.

Use phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately.


Enjoy a RWI book which matches individual phonic knowledge.

Read some common irregular words ('red' words). Demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read.





Maths






Estimate how many objects they can see and check by counting them. Find the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them. In practical activities and discussion, begin to use the vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting.

Begin to use mathematical names for 'solid' 3D shapes and 'flat' 2D shapes, and use mathematical terms to describe shapes. Use everyday language to talk about money in context such as in the role play area.

plenty of water. Learnt through Jigsaw PSHE scheme.




Expressive Art and Design

Play cooperatively as part of a group to develop and act out a narrative.


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

Handle tools, objects, construction and malleable materials safely and with increasing control.

Show a preference for a dominant hand and hold a pencil correctly.

Travel with confidence and skill around, under, over and through balancing and climbing equipment.

Use simple tools to effect changes to materials. Play games cooperatively during PE multi-skills lessons.

Show good control and co-ordination in large and small movements.

Move confidently in a range of ways, safely negotiating space.

Begins to build a repertoire of songs. Explores the different sounds of instruments.



Communication and Language

Listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events and responding to what they hear with relevant comments. Follow and retell a story using pictures, props and words, whilst also beginning to create their own text map. Listen and respond to ideas expressed by others in conversations or discussions.
