	George Friedrich Handel (1685-1789) Georg Friedrich Händel was born in Germany. But since he spent most of his professional life in England, he's better known as George Frederick Handel. Even though Handel was very interested in music, his father (who was a barber and surgeon) was not. There's a story that Handel smuggled a clavichord - a VERY quiet instrument - into the house so that he could practice in secret. Handel's father insisted that his son become a lawyer, until the day that Handel sat down at the keyboard and dazzled a duke. The duke convinced Handel's father to let his son study music. It premiered on 17 July 1717, in response to King George I's request for a concert on the River Thames. Handel also wrote The Messiah and Music for the Royal Fireworks. These have been performed by orchestras all over the world ever since they were composed and are still famous today.
