

Reading spine: Firework Maker's Daughter - Philip Pullman Writing:

Identify the features of a narrative poem. Add detail to sentences using relative clauses using who, whose, which, that, where and when. Use expanded noun phrases in writing by the addition of modifying adjectives, nouns and prepositional phrases. Recognise the structure of stories and introduce paragraphing to help order ideas chronologically. Draft and write non-narrative texts including features such as headings and sub-headings. Evaluate and edit own and peers' writing by suggesting improvements.



Maths

Fractions:

Understand fractions greater than a whole. Partition a mixed number fraction. Position a mixed number fraction on a number line. Compare and order mixed number fractions. Understand what is meant by an improper fraction. Convert a mixed number fraction to an improper fraction (and the reverse). Identify equivalent fraction families (and fractions on a number line). Add and subtract two or more fractions. Subtract from whole amounts. Add and subtract fractions and mixed numbers. **Decimals:** Recognise a tenth as a fraction and as a decimal.

Place tenths on a place value chart and a numberline. Identify a hundredth as a fraction and a decimal. Place hundredths on a place value chart. Divide a 1 and 2 digit number by 100.

History

Rampaging Romans

Learn about the Roman army and how it became a formidable power during the time of the Roman empire. Develop an understanding of the training involved to be a Roman

soldier as well as the military hierarchy used. Identify key equipment used by a soldier in battle.

Understand the organisational skills and formations used by Roman soldiers in battle.

Develop an understanding of the city of Pompeii and the events that led up to and followed the eruption of Vesuvius.

Figure drawing of a Roman soldiers



Final lessons after performance: Appraising and singing songs about water.


