Key composer, genre and instruments



George Friedrich Handel (1685-1789)
Georg Friedrich Händel was born in
Germany. But since he spent most of his
professional life in England, he's better
known as George Frederick Handel.

Even though Handel was very interested in music, his father (who was a barber and surgeon) was not. There's a story that Handel smuggled a clavichord -- a VERY quiet instrument -- into the house so that he could practice in secret. Handel's father insisted that his son become a lawyer, until the day that Handel sat down at the keyboard and dazzled a duke. The duke convinced Handel's father to let his son study music.

Famous works

The **Water Music** is a collection of orchestral movements, often published as three suites, composed by George Frideric Handel. It premiered on 17 July 1717, in response to King George I's request for a concert on the River Thames.

Handel also wrote **The Messiah** and **Music for the Royal Fireworks.** These have been performed by orchestras all over the world ever since they were composed and are still famous today.



By contrast, a more contemporary (modern) piece of music about water we will listen to is by Lee Ru-Ma, better known by his stage name Yiruma. He is a South Korean pianist and composer. He is 43 years old.

Famous works

Yiruma attended Kings Music College in London and in 2001 he wrote **The River Flows in You**, a beautiful, now hugely popular piece for piano. It is written in A major and has lots of smooth running notes to sound like water flowing.
