### Grammar

Indefinite articles, negative and high frequency verbs.  
 Revisiting 1st person singular high frequency verbs me llamo, tengo, soy with a particular focus on vivo from the verb VIVIR a regular IR verb.  
 Use of negative structure appropriate in this unit, 'there is' and 'there is not' (hay and no hay) structure.  
 Noting the upside-down question mark (¿) is used at the beginning of all questions-no exceptions!

Mothers and maternal figures receive gifts such as chocolates, flowers, cards, jewelry and clothes on Mothers' Day.
