Key composer, genre and instruments

Delia Derbyshire 5 May 1937 - 3 July 2001

Delia Ann Derbyshire was an English musician and composer of electronic music. She carried out pioneering work with the BBC Radiophonic Workshop



during the 1960s, including her electronic arrangement of the theme music to the British science-fiction television series Doctor Who.

Her early beginnings

Born in Coventry, as a young girl Delia Derbyshire grew up hearing the eerie sound of air raid sirens. She became fascinated with music (especially composers like Bach and Beethoven) and mathematics, and studied both at Cambridge University.

In 1960 Delia joined the BBC Radiophonic Workshop, a special team who provided unusual sound effects and music for radio and TV programmes. The workshop created the sound of the TARDIS and the voice of the Daleks.

Genre

Electronic music. Delia Derbyshire used technology to create futuristic sounds by speeding up and slowing down sounds. She was a pioneer and a trailblazer in this genre of music!

The Beatles	A world famous pop band in the 1960s and 70s from Liverpool.
voice (keyboard setting)	A button which allows you to select a different instrument as your chosen sound eg: trumpet, flute.
lyrics	The words of a song.
accompaniment	Instrumental music played alongside singing.
body percussion	Percussion sounds made by hitting parts of the body.
melodeon	A 'squeezebox' with a row of buttons to press for different chords.
fiddle	Another name for a violin.
accordion	A 'squeezebox' with a set of piano keys.
