

Good vibrations: Identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with

Identify differences, similarities or changes related to simple scientific ideas and processes.

Record findings using simple scientific language, drawings, labelled diagrams, keys, bar charts and tables.

Recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear.

Find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it.

Recovery from Year 3

English: Key spelling patterns from the Year 3 and 4 word list will be retaught through weekly spelling, writing objectives and handwriting sessions. A continued focus on grammatical terminology and developing sentences will be a key part of home learning assignments.

Maths: Keys skills of maths in relation to number will be recovered and consolidated through a range of starters, quizzes and linked learning objectives. Knowledge and fluency of the multiplication tables and related division facts will also be assessed during the term.

Geography: Map reading and understanding of localities will be developed from Year 3, expanding from understanding of London to neighbouring countries.

Computing: Develop understanding of the internet and e safety, building from previous years. Touch typing skills will be continually developed through sessions as well as home learning assignments.

PE: Pupils will recover lost learning sessions for invasion games focussing on passing and possession skills in order to develop their understanding of strategies and teamwork.
