Key Facts

Mary Stevenson Cassatt (May 22, 1844 – June 14, 1926) was an American artist who lived in France for many years. She often painted mothers and children.

'Children Playing On The Beach' was created in 1884 by Mary Cassatt in the Impressionist style.

In 1884, Cassatt went with her unwell mother to Spain to enjoy the seaside climate, hoping it would make her feel better. This painting is believed to have been painted after her return from this trip, and finished in her studio.

Key Vocabulary	
portrait	A painting, photograph, sculpture, or other artistic representation of a person, in which the face is the main subject of the picture.
self portrait	A portrait of the artist created by themselves.
tint	White added to a colour to make it lighter.
tone	The tone describes the lightness or darkness of a colour.
shade	Black added to a colour to make it darker.
proportion	How the sizes of different parts of a piece of art or design relate to each other.
symmetry	A balance of elements on either side of the centre line of an artwork.
pastel	A type of crayon bound by resin or gum.
