

RE Islam:


Explore the sense of community instilled in those of the Muslim faith and how a Mosque is a central part of this.

Website Design


Design and create own websites, considering content and style, as well as understanding the importance of working collaboratively. Pupils will be working on Google Sites.

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Curriculum connections

Recovery from Year 4

English: Continue to develop understanding and application of fronted adverbials and punctuate them correctly with commas; place the apostrophe in words with irregular plurals such as girls' or boys'; organise ideas around a theme and link paragraphs with fronted adverbials; add relevant details using subordination/relative clauses.

Maths: Flashbacks at the beginning of each lesson will recap Year 4 work in addition to Year 5 work already taught. A focus on developing the children's recall of multiplication and division facts will continue to be a focus.

Computing: Complete a unit on building websites that would usually be taught in Year 4, and further develop their knowledge of using Google software.
