Packaging designers	Packaging designers guide the design process from beginning to end. Antoine Favre	The first examples of jewellery boxes were produced in 1502 by this Swiss watchmaker. He introduced his cylinder-driven box in 1796. Boxes contained tiny drums, tinkling bells and metal combs that created musical sounds when the box opened.
