English

Writing: To write a 'defeating the monster tale'. Use adverbs to describe how something does something. Use simple similes.

Use expanded noun phrases.

Produce an information text to explain the significance of Florence Nightingale's life and work.

Use conjunctions such as fortunately, until, so, because and but. Use apostrophes for contractions.

Use and apply a range of spelling rules including words ending with 'il, -es and -ed suffix with words ending y.

Reading: Retrieve, infer and make comparisons.



Maths

Identify the properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes to make comparisons.

Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forwards and backwards.

Interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts and block diagrams to answer questions.

Add numbers using concrete objects and pictorial representations including those involving numbers and quantities.

Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the correct symbols.

Identify the value of different coins to make totals and amounts.

History

Look After Me: Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Elizabeth Garrett Anderson Compare hospitals before and after Florence Nightingale arrived.

Describe historical events relevant to the life of Florence Nightingale.

Describe other significant medical people from the past (Mary Seacole and Elizabeth Garrett Anderson) and how they impact us now.

Recognise that there are reasons why people in the past acted as they did.

Compare pictures or photographs of people or events in the past and discuss the reliability of photographs, accounts and stories. Ask questions by observing historical evidence.

within communities and families. Explore why Christians go to church and what they do during their time there.

Reflect on personal beliefs related to belonging.

Consider how charity forms an integral part of the Christian faith.



Computing Word processing

Learn about word processing. Develop touch typing skills. Introduce important keyboard shortcuts, as well as simple editing tools including: bold, italics, underline and font colour as well as how to import images.

E-safety: Know what happens to information posted online; how to keep things private online; who we should ask before sharing online; describe different ways to ask for, give, or deny permission online.

PE **Ball skills**

Develop dribbling. passing and receiving in order to keep control and possession of the ball and score. Gymnastics

Explore different pathways (zig-zag, curved), creating movements that can link together.

Learn to play the glockenspiel

Learn how to play the Glockenspiel and time it with other music. Learn to read a music score. Learn to sing songs about Florence Nightingale and accompany them on glockenspiel.
