What happens when a Muslim baby is born?

The words of the **adhan** are whispered into the baby's ear.

The **adhan** tells the baby how to love God and that Allah loves them.

Names are chosen carefully. The meaning symbolises how the parents hope the child will grow up: to be good and kind and to love God.





Muslim family life

Family is very important to Muslims as it was created by Allah to keep people together.

Children are told stories which teach them how to care for nature and how Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) was a special and loving man.

Muslims are taught that they are a part of a group.

They are taught to care for the elderly with kindness and respect.

Children should care for and respect their parents after Allah.

Muslim Prayer

Muslims hear a 'call to prayer' which tells them it is time to pray.

They pray five times a day, every day. There are special words and movements which Muslims use to talk to Allah.

When Muslims pray, they face towards Mecca, a holy city.

Muslims can pray in mosques, prayer rooms, at home or anywhere else. The place has to be clean.

They pray to be close to God.
