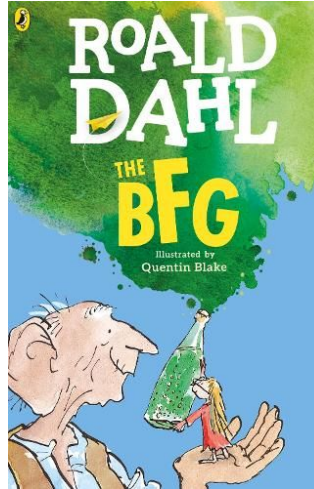

Count from 0 in multiples of 10.
Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.
Identify fact families and relationships between numbers when multiplying and dividing.
Write and calculate mathematical statements for \div using the x tables that they know, including 2-digit numbers.
Use effective methods to multiply and divide 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers involving exchange, partitioning and remainders.
Explain understanding of multiplication and division problems using mathematical vocabulary.
Measure in metres and centimetres and millimetres.
Find equivalent lengths.
Compare lengths.

3 History

Stone Age to Iron Age - Prehistoric Britain

Identify changes from the Stone Age period to the Bronze Age and through the Iron Age.
Explore the impact of metal tools on farming and lifestyle.
Identify how settlements were developed through the ages.
Understand the importance of the discovery of the Amesbury Archer to historians.
Order events chronologically using a timeline.

3 D&T

A Bronze Age inspired bag

Research bags and products and how they have changed over time into the modern day version.
Learn basic skills such as threading a needle and tying off.
Explore types of stitches and real life uses - developing an understanding of the over stitch and running stitch.
Learn about patterns and their uses in relation to bag design.
Create a design for a Bronze Age inspired bag.
Use chosen stitches to join fabric securely.
Evaluate the final product and reflect upon the design process.
