





- ▶ Fred can *only* talk in **sounds**
- ► He says c_a_t. Not cat.
- ▶ We call this Fred talk



Have fun at home with Fred talk


- ► What a tidy r_oo_m!

- Children will be grouped according to learning needs
- ▶ Daily RWI session will include:

Phonics warm-up

Whole class shared reading

Learning 'red' words

Adult – led paired reading and comprehension

Adult-led writing task

Sounding out/blending games

Fine motor skills/letter formation activities

Child-initiated writing opportunities

Reading stories relentlessly

- Read favourite stories
 over and over again
- Read some stories at a higher level than they can read themselves
- Listen to them reading their RWI books. Daily practise improves confidence and skills



Reading in preparation for writing

- Developing fine motor skills – thumb, finger, hand and wrist movements
- Pincer or tripod grip for handwriting
